Q&A for Ottawa's DORA

What is a DORA?

A Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) is a specific area in which alcoholic beverages may be sold by a licensed liquor establishment for outdoor consumption. The DORA designation is designed to make it easier to stroll within the designated area and support local restaurants, stores and public spaces.

How does a DORA work?



Head to a licensed liquor establishment in the DORA and purchase your favorite acoholic beverage in a designaged DORA cup. Establishments that are participating in the program will have a blue 'Beverages Sold Here' DORA decal like the one to the right.

From there, head out onto the sidewalks of Ottawa.

Beverages must stay within the DORA boundaries (see map below). Signs will also indicate these boundaries. Enjoy your beverage while strolling along and visiting locations with a green 'Bring It In' DORA decal indicating beverages are permitted.



Properly dispose of your DORA cup when empty, when entering another liquor permitted establishment, or when entering any business or merchant with the red "Please Dispose Before Entry' DORA decal. DORA cups are one time use and cannot be filled with your own drink.



The hours for the DORA are 11am to 11pm daily.



What are the do's and don'ts?

Do not bring your own drinks into the DORA.

Do not walk around with a purchased drink that is not in a designated DORA cup.

Do not take a beverage purchased at one liquor establishment into another liquor establishment or into a business with the red decal.

Do not take a DORA beverage outside the DORA boundaries.

Do not litter.

Please do, drink responsibly and treat this as a community asset.
