

Heritage Ohio

In our 'Lately' section, we mention that Heritage Ohio came for our Annual Meeting. Go Ottawa is an Aspiring Community of the Heritage Ohio Main Street program. By being a part of this program, we are joining a trusted network with a proven track record for revitalizing our beloved downtowns. It offers to be a valuable resource for our new non-profit: guiding us on our structure, connecting us with other communities, and providing trainings on the tools available to us.

The Main Street program is guided by eight key principles.

- 1) Comprehensive: For successful and lasting results, a comprehensive approach must be used.
- 2) Incremental: Starting with small projects creates progress and momentum at the same time.
- 3) Self-help: Long-term success depends upon the involvement and commitment of the community.
- 4) Public/Private Partnerships: Each sector has a role to play, and each must understand the other's strengths and limitations so that an effective partnership can be forged.
- 5) Identifying and Capitalizing on Existing Assets: Business districts must capitalize on the assets that make them unique.
- 6) Quality: Quality must be emphasized in every aspect of the revitalization program.
- 7) Change: Changes in attitude and practice are necessary to improve current economic conditions.
- 8) Implementation-Oriented: Frequent, visible changes are a reminder that the revitalization process is under way.
